

## STUDENT AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT EVALUATION

In the 2013 legislative session, House Bill 5 (HB5) was adopted. As part of HB5, the *community engagement* component requires for a school district to showcase areas of excellence and success as well as recognize areas in need of improvement.

The statute requires each district to evaluate and designate a performance rating for the district and each of its campuses in the district based on criteria set by a local committee ([TEC 39.0545](#)). The law requires that each district and each campus be assigned a rating of exemplary, recognized, acceptable, or unacceptable. The district and campus performance ratings must be reported annually to TEA through PEIMS, and made publicly available by August 8 of each year beginning with the 2013–14 school year. TEA recognizes Lumin Education as a district with one campus, thus only one set of findings is required to be reported.

Lumin Education formed a committee to determine the criteria to be evaluated in each of the nine required categories. The Student and Community Engagement Evaluation was conducted and the findings are listed below.
